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SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 PROJECT SCOPE

Action Environmental Systems, LLC ("Action") has permits from both the New York State Department of Conservation ("NYSDEC") and the New York City Department of Sanitation ("DSNY") to operate a solid waste transfer station and construction and demolition debris processing facility. The facility is authorized to accept putrescible solid waste, construction and demolition debris, and source separated recyclables. The facility throughput capacity is 3,000 tons per day of solid waste, and the total allowable on site storage capacity is 6,000 cubic yards.

Action operates on an eight (8) acre site located at 920 East 132nd Street, Bronx, NY which has a zoning designation of M3-1 (Heavy Industry).

The facility is currently authorized to operate during the following hours:

Monday - Friday: 24 hours per day;

Saturday: 24 hours Sunday: Closed

Action is seeking the following changes to its allowable hours of operation:

Monday - Friday: 24 hours per day

Saturday: 12 midnight through 7:00 pm;

Sunday: 8:00 pm to 12 midnight.

Action is proposing to eliminate five hours from its permit on Saturday (7:00pm - 12 midnight) in exchange for the ability to operate for four hours on Sunday (8:00 pm - 12 midnight). If approved, the resulting permit would reduce the allowable hours of operation by one hour per week.

All other aspects of the operation will remain as authorized under the existing permit.

1.2 PURPOSE

This Public Participation Plan (PPP) has been developed in conformance with the NYSDEC Environmental Justice and Permitting Policy (Commissioner Policy-29) with the objective of informing and including the local community in the permit review process. Information on Commissioner Policy-29 can be found at the NYSDEC Website: http://www.dec.ny.gov/public/36929.html. Preliminary screening was conducted in accordance with the requirements contained in the DEC CP-29 document entitled "Tips

for Preparing Public Participation Plan." Based on this screening, it was determined that the project was located within or adjacent to an environmental justice area. The Department has requested that Action develop this Public Participation Plan (PPP) to address the Citizens Participation requirements contained in the Commissioner's Policy.

This policy amends the NYSDEC environmental permit review process by identifying potential environmental justice areas and establishing requirements for proposed projects affecting these communities. This policy further requires permit applicants covered by this policy to activity seek public participation throughout the permit review process.

Environmental justice means the fair treatment and meaningful involvement of all people regardless of race, color, or income with respect to the development, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies. Fair treatment means that no group of people, including a racial, ethnic, or socioeconomic group, should bear a disproportionate share of the negative environmental consequences resulting from industrial, municipal, and commercial operations or the execution of federal, state, local, and tribal programs and policies.

Public participation in the permit review process provides opportunities for stakeholders to be informed about and involved with the review of the proposed action. Public participation, including open and effective dialogue with stakeholders, can build relationships, provide a forum to address concerns, and help develop and promote actions that minimize impacts on the surrounding community and the environment.

1.3 OBJECTIVES

It is the objective of the PPP to address the following requirements:

- 1. Identification of stakeholders to the proposed action;
- 2. Description of Action's plan for the preparation and distribution of written information on the proposed action and the environmental permit review process;
- 3. Public information meetings about the proposed project and the permit review process;
- 4. Document repositories; and
- 5. Preliminary Status Report, which summarizes all progress to-date in implementing the Plan, all substantive concerns raised to-date, all resolved and outstanding issues, and an expected time line for completion of the Plan.

SECTION 2.0 COMMUNICATION PLAN

2.1 **PUBLIC OUTREACH**

Action proposes a variety of invitation processes such as: direct mail, newspaper advertisements and notices, and at least one public meeting. Direct mail notifications will be made to property owners near or adjacent to the property, and to those parties identified in stakeholders list. The notification will provide brief summary of the proposed changes, information concerning upcoming meeting, telephone contact information for questions, and locations where a copy of the permit application package is available for review. The meeting will be held at a convenient location to inform the public about the proposed action and to keep them updated on the proposed action and its impacts. The results of these public participation activities will be reported to the NYSDEC.

2.2 PROPOSED CITIZEN PARTICIPATION ACTIVITIES

Action is planning to update the project's status with the local government officials, businesses, church groups, and civic associations listed in Table 1 above by informational mailings as project updates become available. Notification of any public meetings will also be sent to the same parties.

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

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


LOCATION MAP


